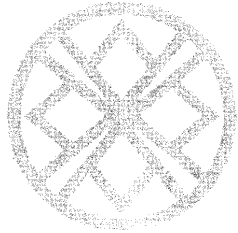


VisionQuest Houston Wedlock Center

1937-2014

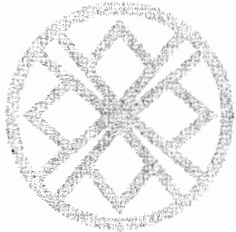
Mr. Wedlock was an instrumental figure within VisionQuest. He served in Vietnam as a Green Beret and was a prominent re-enactor of the Buffalo Soldiers.



The Houston Wedlock Center

- The Houston Wedlock Center is a VisionQuest program funded through The Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR)
- The contract was awarded in August of 2019 for 3 years
- The Center is VisionQuest's 7th program funded through ORR, VisionQuest currently operates ORR programs in Arizona and Pennsylvania and has been awarded contracts for facilities in Texas, Arizona, California and New Mexico
- The Center will be richly staffed with one direct youth care worker for every eight children
- The Center is also required to be licensed by the State, and must comply with federal ORR's compliance standards. ORR representatives visit weekly
- The Center will serve up to 90 male unaccompanied children at a time, ages 11-17



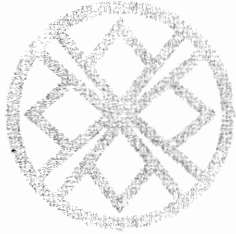


Services at The Houston Wedlock Center

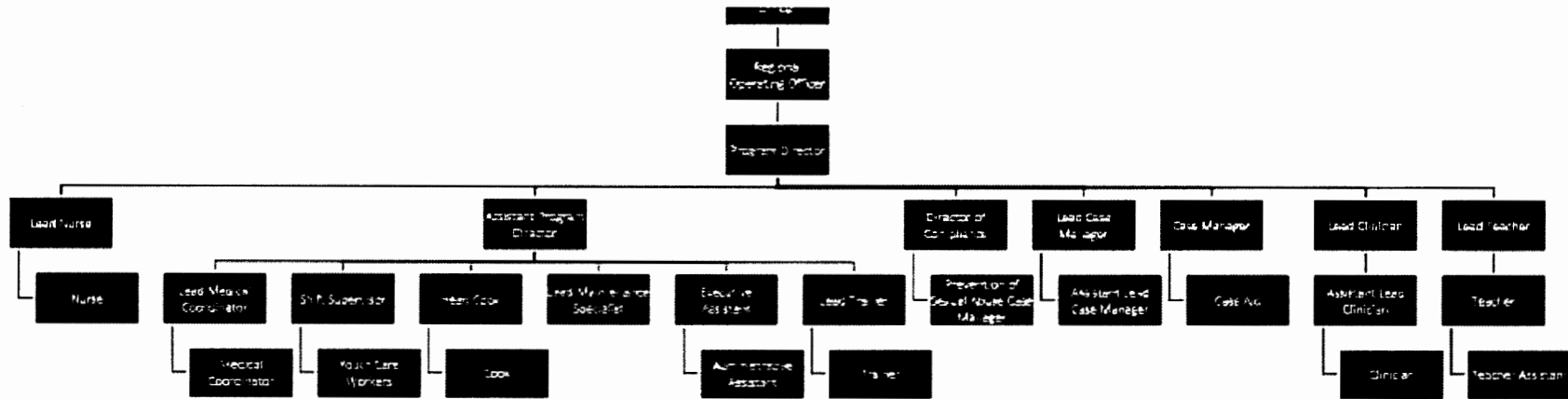
VisionQuest will provide temporary residential dormitory style housing for male children as staff work to identify sponsors, family reunification and permanent residency opportunities for the children in our care.

Youth will receive the following services while on campus:

- Classroom Education
- Comprehensive Health Care
- Socialization and Recreation
- Mental Health Services
- Access to Legal Representation Services
- In House Case Management Teams provide:
 - Family Reunification Services & Sponsorship Identification
- In House Clinical Teams Provide:
 - Trauma Focused- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and Other Clinical Services
- Vocational Training



Staffing Summary



- The Houston Wedlock Center will employ up to 85 staff
- The starting salary is approximately \$30,000 with full benefits
- Minimum 21 years of age with Spanish language and high school diploma / GED
