THE HISTORY OF SECOND BAPTIST CHURCH

Second Baptist Church stands today as a beacon guiding and directing persons to the Light of Christ.

The pastoral leadership of Second Baptist Church has helped us in the Lord's service. We recognize the monumental contribution of these twelve men who labored to provide opportunities and enriched responsibilities for members of an evolving church. Pastors who served were: Rev. Charles Augustis, Rev. E. M. Wright, Rev. L. G. Jordan, Rev. J. W. Carr, Rev. Steve Smith, Rev. Reuben Anderson, Rev. C. J. Hardy, Rev. A. W. Smith, Rev. I. H. Kelly, Rev. W. S. Brent, Rev. S. H. James, Sr., and Rev. S. H. James, Jr..

In July of 1879, Rev. Charles Augustis and twelve other dedicated Christian men and women met in Worship at a location on Indiana and Goliad Streets. These persons founded and were charter members of Macedonia Baptist Church, later renamed Second Baptist Church in October 1890. In addition to Rev. Augustis, other founding members were: Rev. Reuben Anderson, his wife, Mrs. Elvina Anderson; Mrs. Anna Hill, Mrs. Alice Lewis, Mrs. L. M. Logan, Mrs. Dadie Graham, Mrs. Laura Franklin, Mr. H. T. Harvey, Mr. Benjamin Jones, Mr. Jesse Riddle, Mr. Jesse Winn, and Mr. Alexander Hogan.

Our present pastor, The Rev. Dr. Robert L. Jemerson began his ministry with the church on September 1, 1993. Since the beginning of his ministry over 1000 persons have been added to the church. His programs of Homework at Second Baptist (H.A.S.), Advent and Lenten Devotions, Teddy Bear Christmas Tree, Youth Music/Piano Workshops, Pastor and Family's Christmas Dinner, School Vacation Day Camps, Deacons' Ministry, Upgrading Office Equipment and Computer Systems, Health Fair, Student and Teachers' Rededication Services, Marriage Vows Renewal, Youth Dinner Theaters, Church Library, Thanksgiving In The Park, acquisition of land, funding and building a Habitat for Humanity Home (2005), the addition of administrative and ministerial staff and the construction of the Second Baptist Church Community Center at the cost of 4.1 million dollars in 2012 have added greatly to the spirituality of the church and enhancement of relations with the community. In collaboration with the "Cactus Pear", he brought for the first time to the Eastside community, members of the San Antonio Symphony, exposing 800 young people to Classical Music. In 2016 and 2018 "Cactus Pear" returned to share with over 325 senior citizens. In addition, he led the "The San Antonio Community of Churches" in 2003 contributing over \$35,000.00 to Black Churches throughout the nation; destroyed by arson, \$9,000.00 was given to three locally flood damaged churches in October 1998. He lead the National Council of Christians and Jews in honoring Dr. Frank Bryant, the first Black Layman in its forty year history, he was also instrumental in the organization honoring Dr. Charles and Dr. Marie Thurston, the first Black couple in its 56th year history. Rev. Jemerson led the church in honoring America's military members, veterans, and civil servants, at our annual event the Christmas Ball featuring the Air Force Band of the Southwest. Pastor Jemerson serves as the Clergy Endorser for The Progressive National Baptist Convention.

Several sites have served as locations for the church building during the past **one hundred-thirty-nine** years. Live Oak and Dawson Streets were the second site for the church, and in **1894** a frame building was constructed on the corner of Chestnut and Center Streets. In **1903** Rev. A.W. Smith led the church in a **rebuilding** program to include a **parsonage**. From 1909-1910 under the pastorate of **Rev. I. H. Kelly**, the **beautiful old stone church** was erected at the same Chestnut and Center Street site. Many local, state, and national meetings were held at the church because of its accommodations and its location near the heart of downtown. In 1968, due to the city's expansion and redevelopment, **Second Baptist Church** moved to its present location, 3310 East Commerce Street. Under the **leadership** of **Rev. S. H. James, Jr.**, the church purchased a five acre site for construction of a **new church** and development of a playground to help meet the needs of the **community**. The Second Baptist Church of today has not forgotten her glorious past. The **Narthex Screen** composed of stained glass windows from the **old church** is a **memorial** to this church's past deeds and accomplishments, reflecting **wisdom** for future generations to build upon.

Previous Convention affiliations and District Associations were with The Baptist Missionary and Educational Convention of Texas, The General Baptist Convention of America, The National Baptist Convention of America, Inc., and The Guadalupe District Association, Inc. Presently, the church affiliations are with The Progressive National Baptist Convention, Inc., The American Baptist Churches, and The La Grange District Association.

FORMER SECOND BAPTIST CHURCH PASTORS



Rev. Andrew Smith - 1890-1904 Between 1879 and 1890, the church relocated to Live Oak and Dawson Streets. Reverend Andrew W. Smith served as pastor from 1890-1904, and led the church in a rebuilding program that included a parsonage that used material from the old church building. On January 30, the church purchased property on Chestnut Street for \$420. Macedonia Baptist Church became Second Baptist Church on October 24. The church continued to prosper and purchased property on the corners of Chestnut and Live Oak Streets and Crockett and Center Streets for \$550. In 1894, Second Baptist Church relocated to a new frame structure on Chestnut and Center Streets. The church did not have a baptistery so it held the sacrament of baptism in the river near Hot Wells.

Rev. I. H. Kelly - 1904 - 1934 In 1904, Reverend I. H. Kelly became the third pastor. On April 19, 1909, a deed was signed releasing the southern half of the property at Chestnut and Center Streets to the church. On May 26th members were so eager to have an adequate church that they paid a dollar for plowing a round to break ground for the foundation of an impressive stone structure that became a San Antonio landmark. The church had a panoramic contour, towering steeple and authentic stained glass windows. These outstanding characteristics warranted the historic edifice to be included as an entry in Dulmann's collections in the Library of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas at the Alamo. Growth brought on division and in 1934, Reverend Kelly organized the Rose of Sharon Church and many of the membership joined him there.

Rev. W. S. Brent - 1934 - 1940 Reverend W.S. Brent, then pastor of Antioch Baptist Church in Beaumont, Texas, answered the call to be the pastor of Second Baptist Church. He brought with him exceptional ministerial skills and experience, all of which would be needed to deal with pending lawsuits against the church and member hostility. He faced three major problems: reuniting the membership, re-spiritualizing the membership and building the church's organization structure. He began by inaugurating a teaching and preaching program where he reunited and re-spiritualized the congregation through regular prayer meetings and inspiring soul-stirring worship services. His leadership resulted in the improvement of the financial status, and the church purchased new pews for the sanctuary and a home for a parsonage, installed a new heating system and redecorated the church. This creation of unity and prosperity resulted in the St. James Baptist Church in Fort Worth, Texas calling him in 1939.

Rev. S. H. James - 1940 - 1944 In 1940, Reverend S.H. James, Sr., of Nashville, Tennessee became the pastor. He had served as a dean, teacher and lecturer in local, state and national congresses and conventions and had a keen concern for Christian and youth education. He was a man who exhibited zeal, dedication, understanding, warmth, intelligence, courage and congeniality. Highlights of his ministry include: Fellowship Hall was renovated, Sunday School classrooms were added, the kitchen was relocated and modernized, the Vacation Bible School was expanded and the church debt was liquidated. The Teller was started as the church bulletin and communication vehicle to aid in the dissemination and promotion of the church programs and is still used today, church radio broadcasting among African Americans in San Antonio was pioneered and the church became involved in Christian Education from the local to the national levels. In February of 1944, after a prolonged illness, the Lord shortened his ministry and called him home.

Rev. S. H. James, Jr. - 1944 - 1992 On February 28, 1944, with brave hearts, courage, wisdom and vision the church called Reverend S. H. James, Jr., the 26 year old son of the late pastor. This election of a pastor so young and unmarried broke a 65-year tradition. He was a soft-spoken but strong man with dynamic plans. By effectively matching talents and church groups with church growth tasks he was able to accomplish many improvement and renovation projects to the church edifice, the landscaping of the church grounds and the equipping of two rooms in Fellowship Hall for the use as a nursery for babies and small children while their parents were in worship services in 1949. There was a new emphasis on the prayer service; the service was divided into four 15-minute segments and included lay leadership. As early as 1953, there were 21 successfully functioning auxiliaries and the membership had almost doubled.

REV. DR. GINA JACOBS-STRAIN GENERAL SECRETARY, AMERICAN BAPTIST CHURCHES USA

Rev. Dr. Gina C. Jacobs-Strain was called as General Secretary of American Baptist Churches USA by the Board of General Ministries on November 4, 2024, and began to serve on February 1, 2024.

Dr. Jacobs-Strain's faith journey began when she committed her life to Christ during her elementary school years. Since then, she has been dedicated to sharing the gospel, nurturing authentic relationships, engaging in hands-on ministry, developing leaders, and transforming communities while speaking the prophetic word in love.

Her rich ministry experience includes her previous role as Executive Director of American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM), where she led transformative initiatives such as the AB GIRLS program, "Building Bridges and Gateways to Girls' Future/Hie-STEAM," empowering girls to discover God's creative potential through science and technology. Under her leadership, ABWM expanded its ministries, including the Beloved Community initiative and domestic violence advocacy, while offering nationwide seminars for young adult women.

Rev. Dr. Jacob-Strain also held various pastoral roles, including Transitional Pastor at First Baptist Church of New Market in Piscataway, N.J., Interim Pastor at St. Paul Baptist Church in Atlantic Highlands, N.J., and Associate Regional Pastor for Women in Ministry with the American Baptist Churches of New Jersey (ABC-NJ). She currently serves as an Associate Minister of Christian Education at St. Paul Baptist Church in Montclair, N.J.

As General Secretary, Dr. Jacobs-Strain helps gather the denomination through events such as Biennial Mission Summits, the National Leadership Council, the National Executive Council, and other caucuses and special events. Recently, the denomination has also engaged the denomination through Everyday ABC Conversations, wherein presenters focus on Harmony, and an October 2024 Webinar series on Domestic Violence Awareness and Well-being. These gatherings foster unity, fellowship, and collective mission within the American Baptist churches. The Office of the General Secretary also supports local congregations by providing stewardship resources, leadership development retreats, pastor conferences, and regional board training.

Rev. Dr. Jacobs-Strain continues to carry out the vision of the Office of the General Secretary by empowering and uniting God's people and facilitating essential conversations. She upholds ABCUSA's core values of integrity, altruism, interconnectedness, achievement, creativity, and passion, striving to create a faith community that reflects the gospel's power through love, grace, and hope.

Rev. Dr. Jacobs-Strain earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Rutgers University and graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Master of Divinity degree from Drew University's Theological School. She was also honored with the Old Testament Studies Scholar Award from the Biblical Studies Department. In 2015, she received a Certificate of Excellence from Palmer Theological Seminary & ABC-NJ Academy, and in 2017, she completed the Nehemiah-Leadership Program. In May 2020, she attained a Doctor of Ministry from Duke University. She is married to Clifton Strain, and together they have three sons.

ADVENT A TIME OF ANTICIPATION

Advent, a period of four weeks before the Nativity, is observed in the Western Churches as a Season of Solemnity of Emotion and action, and a Great Time of Anticipation!

It became a general observance in the sixth century. Its four Sundays were believed to have been introduced into the calendar by Gregory the Great, and on these grounds, the Gospel readings were chosen for the four Sundays preceding the Birth of our Savior.



Traditionally, the candles represent
The number of weeks before the
Christmas celebration. They represent
FAITH, FREEDOM, JUSTICE, MERCY. The
Large Candle or "CHRIST CANDLE" reminds
us that Christ is the "LIVING LIGHT OF THE WORLD."

THE MEANING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light . . . " (Isaiah 9:2).

Light is the most powerful symbol of the Advent season. For the four weeks before Christmas, the People of God wait in prayerful hope for the dawning of the Messiah, the Perfect Light to burn away the darkness of sin and alienation.

The first reference to Christmas as we know it is found in a Christian calendar of the fourth century. The feast of Jesus' birth was celebrated by the early Christians of Rome on December 25, to coincide with the pagan feast of *Sol Invictus* "The Birthday of the Unconquered Sun." It is believed that Pope Julius I adopted this pagan feast of the *Sun* to celebrate the birth of the *Son* of God.

The lights of Christmas trees and decorations should remind us that Christ is God's light to the world, shattering the darkness of mistrust and misunderstanding.

In the midst of the shopping, decorating, cooking, writing Christmas cards, and other activities of the holiday season, the custom of the *Advent wreath* is an excellent way for families and communities to keep the real meaning of Christmas in perspective.

The *four candles* of the Advent wreath represent the four weeks of Advent and the thousands of years that the People of God awaited the promised Messiah. The candles are *purple* in color, a reminder of the spirit of penance and prayer that marks the Advent season (one of the candles may be rose for the Third Sunday of Advent, traditionally known as "Gaudete Sunday" from the opening words of that Sunday's liturgy: "Rejoice in the Lord always!"). Each week one candle is lit until all four are aglow on the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

The *round* wreath itself symbolizes the eternity of God and the Father's presence throughout human history. *Evergreen* branches are often used in decorating the wreath, reminders of the eternal life of God in Christ.



Over hundreds of years, Advent has become a favorite custom for those who celebrate Christmas.

The circle of the wreath represents eternity, while the lighting of candles renews the journey towards hope, love, joy and peace in the world.




